1.	To plan, manage and deliver teaching, and provide advice as a member of the Neuroscience Teaching Group and programmes of study, in a variety of settings including small group tutorials as well as lectures, practical classes, and final year undergraduate projects.		
2.	To supervise and provide first line support for final year undergraduate student research projects (e.g. laboratory experiments, data analysis, systematic reviews).		
3.	Identify the learning needs of students and ensure that the content, methods of delivery and learning materials meet the defined learning objectives of undergraduate Neuroscience courses.		
4.	To collaborate with academic colleagues on areas of shared interest e.g. course development, curriculum changes.		
5.	To be involved in collaborative decision making with colleagues on the assessment of students work to identify and respond to the diversity of students' needs.		
6.	To contribute to the effective management and administration of the School by performing duties allocated by the Head of Division. This may include responsibility for administrative duties in areas such as admissions, examinations, and assessment of progress and student attendance.		
7.	To contribute to organising resources and effective decision making in support of teaching. Maintain records and materials in support of teaching activities		
8.	To develop and continually update knowledge and understanding in field or specialism and to seek ways of improving own performance by reflecting on pedagogical teaching design, delivery and obtaining and analysing feedback in order to develop own teaching and learning skills.
